CCJS majors must follow the following course sequence:

*CCJS100 and/or CCJS105 & Math (Math107 or STAT100) →  
 Advanced Statistics → CCJS300 → CCJS Criminology/Theory Course*

Courses we accept for Advanced Statistics include: BIOM301; BMGT230; CCJS200; ECON230; EDMS451; GEOG306; GEOL351; GVPT422; INST314; JOUR405; PSYC200; or SOCY201.

Students must request permission for courses via [ccjsstamps.umd.edu](http://ccjsstamps.umd.edu).

Prerequisites are strictly enforced in the CCJS major. Listed prerequisites cannot be taken at the same time as a course.

All students are limited to 3 CCJS courses prior to the first day of classes. Starting on the first day of classes, students can register for more than 3.

### Important Reminders:

- Students must earn at least 120 cumulative credits to graduate.
- Students must take a minimum of 30 credits at UMD.
- 12 upper-level major credits must be earned at UMD.
- Effective for UMD students matriculating in Fall 2022 and beyond, no more than 70 credits earned at a two-year institution shall be transferrable toward a bachelor's degree.
- Please see your degree audit and meet with CCJS Advising to review your remaining requirements.
