AASD Major Benchmarks

Benchmark Requirements: In accordance with University policy, the African American Studies Department has established benchmark requirements. Students are expected to demonstrate continuing progress in their majors by completing prerequisite or required courses with the appropriate grades within an established timeframe. Students who do not complete benchmark requirements will need to choose a new major and will not be permitted to return to the African American Studies major at a later time.

Benchmark 1: *AASD majors must complete the following courses within two semesters of entering the major:*

- Academic Writing with D- or higher
- Fundamental Studies Math with D- or higher
- Additional Gen Ed course 1 with D- or higher
- Additional Gen Ed course 2 with D- or higher
- Choose **first** Required Course: AASP 100, 101, 200, **or** 202 with C- or higher
- Choose **second** Required Course: AASP 100, 101, 200, **or** 202 with C- or higher
